- ▣ **Building on Military Skills:** Acknowledge that Veterans possess valuable leadership skills gained in the military. Focus on how these skills can be adapted and applied within the American Legion context.
- ▣ **Identifying Future Leaders:** Encourage Legionnaires to identify and mentor those with leadership potential, ensuring the future of the organization.

- **Servant Leadership:** Servant leadership aligns with the values of many Veterans. Focus on leading by serving the needs of the post, its members and the community.
- **Empowering Others:** Effective leadership involves empowering others, delegating tasks, and fostering a collaborative environment.
