## ORATORICAL SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The State Oratorical Contest sponsored by the Kansas American Legion was held on Saturday, March 13 at Pearce-Keller Post #17 in Manhattan. The four finalists representing their District were required to give an 8-10 minute prepared oration on the United States Constitution. The contestants were required to give their presentation without any notes, podium, papers, or microphones. They were judged by a panel of five prominent citizens from the Manhattan area. The contestants were judged on several aspects of their presentation including originality, skill in selecting examples, logic, knowledge of subject matter, voice and diction, word selection, and body action and eye contact.

After their prepared remarks the contestants were required to speak on one of four assigned topics selected by National Headquarters. One topic is chosen by drawing from the four choices and each contestant speaks on the same subject. The contestants were required to speak three to five minutes on the assigned topic. This year's assigned topic was Article II, Section 7 of the Constitution. All contestants recited

their orations with skill and enthusiasm. The Judges had the difficult task of choosing the top contestants that would receive top honors and money for college.

The 2021 State Champion is Owen Miller from Pittsburg representing Third District. Normally, the state champion would be sent to Indianapolis to compete at the National Oratorical Contest. However, as there will be no National Oratorical competition this year, all State Champions, including Owen, will receive a \$5,000 scholarship from National in addition to the \$750 scholarship from The Department of Kansas.

The second place award of a \$500 scholarship went to Hever Arjon from Dodge City, representing Eight District. The third place finisher was Lincoln Gibson from Topeka, representing First District. He will receive a \$250 scholarship. The fourth place award of a \$150 scholarship went to Malik Ngugi from Wichita, representing Fifth District.

In addition, Emporia State University and Tabor College also offer scholarships to the first four winners in this year's contest.

## Department Convention Topeka May 14-16

The Ramada Hotel & Convention Center, in Topeka will serve as the site of the 102nd Annual Convention of The American Legion Department of Kansas. Joining the Legion in Convention will be the American Legion Auxiliary and the Sons of the American Legion who will hold their own independent Conventions in addition to two joint sessions involving all three groups.

Now is the time to make housing reservations by calling the Ramada at 785-234-5400. Room rates for the Convention are \$91.00 and includes a full breakfast buffet.

The Convention is expected to feature a number of speakers including American Legion National Vice Commander Bruce Feuerbach from Iowa, Auxiliary Divisional National Vice President Ruth Gott from Michigan, and S.A.L. National Vice Commander Chris Cook from Oklahoma,

several of this year's Youth Champions, and Kansas' Fire and Policeman of the Year.

Various awards for Americanism, Children & Youth, Post Histories, Post Service Officers will also be presented. A highlight of the Convention will be the drawing for this Spring's Sweepstakes with special prizes available should any of the thirteen winners be present during the drawing on Sunday.

The Convention will conclude on Sunday with a Memorial Service followed by the election of Department Officers for the 2021-2022 legionnaires are encouraged to attend the Convention as a delegate, alternate, or guest. Post Adjutants will be mailed pre-registration materials on April 14 (pre-registration is preferred, however "walk-ins" are always welcomed). To attend as a delegate or alternate contact your Post Adjutant to inform them you wish to represent your Post.

Every little bit helps, ask your Post adjutant to show you the CPR so you have an idea of the kind of things that are reported. If we don't toot our own horn no one else will either.

If I miss seeing you at your District Convention I hope to at Department Convention (May 14-16) or Leadership College (June 4-6). Department leadership has some new ideas, and we hope to implement at least a few of them this year at ALLC. As soon as we have a location determined you will be notified so be looking for registration information soon!

The American Legion is concerned about the welfare of our nation's youth, and suicide threatens them. Among adolescents ages 15 to 24 this problem continues to be the second leading cause of death and the second leading cause of death for 10 to 14-year-olds. The Journal of the American Medical Association sites that over 6,200 suicides occurred in 2017 within the age group of 15-24. Familiarize yourself with the warning signs, and you may be able to save a life. Every life is sacred and must be preserved.

Warning Signs of Suicide:

- Abrupt changes in eating habits
- Aggressive behavior
- Changes in sleeping habits.
- Decline in schoolwork.
- Depression
- Drug or alcohol abuse
- Giving away possessions.
- Legal questions about death
- Loss of interest in regular activities
- Loss of energy
- Mood swings and personality changes
- Neglect of personal appearance
- Preoccupation with death
- Previous suicide attempts
- Suddenly happy after long depression
- Talking about life after death.
- Unnecessary and dangerous risk-taking
- Withdrawal from friends or family

One sign may not signal trouble, however, more than one sign lasting two weeks or longer is often an indication help is needed. Take all talk of suicide seriously. Listen carefully and give the person a chance to express his or her feelings. Let him or her know you are concerned and want to help. If you, or someone you know is contemplating suicide, seek help right away. Immediately inform an adult such as a parent, teacher, coach, principal, clergy, counselor, or doctor. Or call a crisis center hotline.

In addition the enrollment fee includes air conditioned dorm housing at the College—attendees must bring their own sheets, pillow, pillow case, blanket, bath soap, towels and personal items.
