#### BOY SCOUT BANKRUPTCY RAISES LIABILITY CONCERN By Rick Miller, Department of Kansas Scouting Chair

By now many of your Posts your unit seeking? (So

have been contacted by scouting units in your area. The Scouting Committee would like to provide you with some basic information and let you know we are here if you have further questions.

Following the highly publicized lawsuits and bankruptcy proceedings of recent years, many churches have been instructed by their state and national leadership to stop chartering scouting troops and cub scout packs (units). Some Churches have been sponsoring multiple units, as a result, several units with almost a century long relationship with their sponsors are seeking new charter organizations. You may be contacted by one or more of these units. Here are some key questions you may want to ask, if you have more please feel free to reach out to the committee.

1. How many units are currently chartered by the church?

2. What level of support is

your unit seeking? (Some are seeking new meeting facilities and everything with a charter, some are continuing to meet at the same church but need a new charter representative.)

3. Who is your current unit leadership, how long have they been in their role and how long do they plan on remaining in the role?

Of course, to charter or not to charter is purely a local decision. Some advantages to chartering a troop, a pack, or both is increased involvement in your communities and in a youth-based Americanism program. This will hopefully increase the submission of Eagle Scout of the Year scholarship applications as well.

YS STATE

Each year The Kansas American Legion Boys State provides hundreds of high school students a hands-on opportunity to actively participate in establishing a representative form of government from the ground up. Prior to arriving on the Kansas State University campus which serves as the site of the program, each student (known as Staters) is assigned to either the Nationalist or Federalist "political party" based upon their responses to a questionnaire.

Immediately after arriving in Manhattan and checking-in on Sunday afternoon Staters form city and county governments. The next two days are spent drafting local ordinances, and carrying out the operation of cities and counties; at the same time campaigns for state offices are launched and within days Staters elect officials to their new state; Boys State.

Hands-on activities include writing a state constitution, drafting and passing a budget, establishing a Supreme Court, and enacting laws compatible with today's society and needs. How decisions of the masses affect Staters as individuals is demonstrated by

## CADET LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY

On June 12 up to 50 young Kansans will gather for the 51st annual Cadet Law Enforcement Academy session at the Highway Patrol Training Center in Salina. Sponsored by The American Legion, Legion Auxiliary and KS Highway Patrol, the Academy provides high school students an opportunity to learn methods employed to enforce city, county, state, and federal statues with the goal of instilling a better appreciation for those who enforce those laws.

The Academy is not a recruitment program for law enforcement. Students attending past sessions have had a wide variety of backgrounds, interests, and career plans. However many students considering careers in law enforcement, as attorneys, and government service have attended as a means to solidify their plans to pursue such careers.

Open to both male and females, all applicants must be high school junior, or senior, or equivalent, with at least a C+ average scholastically and be physically capable of fully participating in all activities during the week long program. Instruction includes firearms and firing range safety, personal defense, law enforcement history and techniques, pursuit driving on a skid-pad under controlled conditions, practical emergency medical procedures, aircraft use in law enforcement (weather permitting), and the responsibilities of citizens regardless of age.

Primarily classes are conducted by Highway Patrol personnel however representatives of other agencies such as the FBI, KBI, Wildlife and Parks, city and county officials augment the instruction provided throughout the week. Parents and families are encouraged to attend graduation ceremonies on Friday evening, June 17.

Students are encouraged to apply early. Completed applications must include endorsements by a doctor (attesting to the applicant's physical condition), their high school principal or superintendent, their local American Legion Post Commander or Auxiliary Unit President, and a local law enforcement officer. A sponsorship fee of \$300 and application fee of \$50 includes housing, meals and supplies needed during the session must also accompany the application and can come from any source (Post, Unit, Squadron, Chapter, a local merchant, parents, etc.).

Applications must be received by March 31.



Three dues notices have been sent by National Headquarters and a fourth one will be sent out in January, but the easy ones have been renewed. The remaining non-renewed members will require personal contact or phone calls, so organize membership efforts now before those members hit the cutoff date and become delinquent. For those Posts with club rooms or lounges, your clubroom workers should have a list of unpaid members available to them and they should be collecting dues from those non-renewed members. Listed below are a few suggestions how to collect membership.

Divide all unpaid renewals among your Membership Committee and Post Officers. These people should contact every person on their list this month.

Divide your Membership Committee and Post Officers into teams similar to the above suggestion. Perhaps your Post can award a prize to the most successful team, or even an individual award given.

Always be ready with a 30 second to a minute 'elevator pitch' on the importance and benefits of Legion membership, and be confident in what you say and how you say it.

Use the "buddy system" to organize an old fashioned membership drive to seek out new membership, renewals, and those who can be reinstated.

Ask those who have

never helped out on a membership drive to help. Who knows, you might find a "go getter" in the Post. Ask all your current membership to help out by remembering who went into service with them and get them signed up. We all know one veteran, maybe a close friend or a relative, maybe even a co-worker who isn't a Legion member (especially with the Legion Act that was passed a few years ago making eligibility open from December 7, 1941 to present date). We should all reach out to that veteran that we know, and ask, sometimes that's all it takes to recruit a new member. Remember membership is everyone's responsibility!

With many Department events coming such as Mid-Winter in Salina January 28-30th many of us will be staying in hotels overnight. I would like to remind evervone that American Legion members are offered discounts on many hotels with your membership, some up to 20%. Before you book your next hotel check out Legion.org to see what discounts you're eligible for. This is one of the many benefits we receive with our active membership.

**Affairs Mailing Delays** Due to supply chain and staffing shortages, the vendor contracted by the Government Publishing Office to provide printing services for the Department of Veterans Affairs is experiencing delays in printing and mailing notification letters to Veterans and claimants. The disruption may impact the ability of some claimants to meet required deadlines via written correspondence with the VA.

In response to the mailing delays and to protect the best interest of claimants, the Veterans Benefits Administration is extending its response period by 90-calendar days for claimants with letters dated between July

If a claimant does not reply to a time-limited notification, such as, making an election of benefits or services, or reporting for a scheduled compensation and pension examination, VBA will not take adverse action to deny, reduce or terminate benefits and services unless 1) the claimant is contacted and there is documentation of their right to respond; 2) the requested information has been received, or 3) the response period has lapsed.

VA and GPO are proactively working to quickly address the mailing delays. For questions on this matter, Veterans and claimants can contact their American Legion Service Officer.

• You should publicize your programs and activities. Have the Mayor or other local Official issue a proclamation declaring April as Children and Youth Month. Your Post Commander should issue a news release proclaiming

April as Children and Youth Month and list what the Post will be doing for its annual observance.

• Remember programs affecting the children and youth of your community are news!! Invite the news media to your activities and keep them informed.

• The American Legion Department of Kansas has several outstanding Children and Youth programs offered:

• American Legion Baseball: A / AA / AAA, entries must be in by May 15, 2022.

• Kansas Boy's State: applications must be in by April 2022

• Cadet Law: applications must be in by March 31, 2022

• Oratorical Contest: The Department Oratorical Contest is March 12, 2022. Check with

assigning each an occupation and a corresponding computerized bank account: within minutes of passing laws, license fees, taxes etc. Staters can view the "real-life" impact on themselves.

Instruction is provided by Legionnaires, at least one member of the Kansas Highway Patrol, and former Staters who are well versed in the function of representative government. Several elected officials annually visit and address Staters throughout the week. Naturally time is allotted for fun activities during the week such as a "talent night" and various sports.

At a minimum Boys State instills citizenship and demonstrates every individual is capable of making a difference. Thousands of lifelong friendships have been forged at Boys State and graduates often receive special consideration when applying for scholarships or employment.

Two Staters will be selected to represent Kansas as Senators during Boys' Nation held at Marymount University in Washington, DC this July. Staters who are the sons or grandsons of a veteran may

apply for a Samsung scholarship.

Application and information packets for this year's June 5 to 11 session have been mailed to every Kansas high school, every Post, and to past sponsors including private individuals, and civic organizations. Fees for the week long course is \$300 per Stater to be paid by the sponsor(s) plus a \$50 fee paid by the student's parents or the Stater himself.

Applicants must be a high school Junior (will be a Senior this fall), be a self starter, involved in extracurricular activities in their school or community, and rank within the top half of their class scholastically. Completed applications must be received by March 31, 2021; Staters and sponsors are encouraged to apply early.

Legionnaires are asked to seek out potential Staters by visiting their local high schools and assist in locating sponsors and co-sponsors for each student.
