elected national commander of The American Legion on Aug. 31, 2023, in Charlotte, N.C., during the 104th national convention. Seehafer likes to say, "It's personal," when it comes to The American Legion's mission of serving Veterans and their families. He is continuing the theme of "Be the One," to prevent veteran suicide.

An ordained minister from Wisconsin, he earned his American Legion eligibility through service in the U.S. Navy and Navy Reserve, where he served as a military chaplain. A member of American Legion Post 157 in Horicon, Wis.. Seehafer served in a number of American Legion offices at every level, including national chaplain and commander of the Department of Wisconsin.

Born and raised in Merrill, Wis., he lettered in

cross-country track while in high school and later received a bachelor's degree in pastoral ministry from Concordia University and a Master of Divinity at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Ind.

Seehafer was installed as assistant pastor of St. Stephen Lutheran Church in Horicon in 1997 and continues to serve as administrative pastor of the church and its school. His American Legion Post was recognized for "100 percent" and "All-Time High" in membership during his terms as commander and adjutant. Other honors include District Commander's New Post Achievement Award, Silver Brigade, and Post 157 Legionnaire of the Year.

In 2023. Seehafer earned an Outstanding Heroism Award for administering the Heimlich maneuver to a choking victim at an American Legion dinner.

National Commander Seehafer and his wife, Stacey, who is a member of American Legion Auxiliary Unit 157, live in Beaver Dam, Wis. Dan's son, Jacob, and daughter, Emma, are also Members of the Post 157 family. Dan is the son of the late Lester Seehafer and Jean Sabatke.

We have started the membership year strong, and your membership team has been very busy. In July ten of us headed to the annual Membership Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana. This year's Membership Conference provided some great training and invaluable time for your team to discuss membership goals.

At the end of August your membership team was on the move again, this time to Charlotte, North Carolina for The National American Legion Convention, where we attended numerous workshops on membership. In September we were able to apply some of the ideas/ concepts while "working" at the State Fair. Several new members were signed up and some members were moved from Post 58 into local Posts. Thank you to everyone who supported the fair.

Your membership team has developed a plan to ensure those Posts that work hard are rewarded. Every Post that meets the monthly Department goal (Aug 20%, Sep 40%, Oct 60%, Nov 80%, Dec 100% of goal) will be eligible to win \$200 for each monthly drawing, for a total of \$1000. Eligible Posts will be collected each month from the Department membership list and the drawing will be held during the Second Sunday membership meetings. Congratulations to the first two Posts who were drawn for the \$200: Mayetta Post 410 and Florence Post 308.

In September the District Commanders, Vice Commanders, along with myself and the Department Commander meet for a Department Membership Workshop. We covered different

ideas such as utilizing QR codes for membership and events; Training in a Box and Training Tuesday, both located at legion.org; Active and Passive Recruitment; Retention; Post 58; transfers; Buddy Checks, and membership incentives. Your District leadership will be reaching out and scheduling a time for each District to work on membership.

Hope you had a great summer and are doing well! God has truly been good to us. Let us not forget to thank Him for all our blessings!

In this article, I want to share an experience with you that reminded me of a story I read many years ago. I was out for my afternoon walk one day when I looked up and saw a dove perched on a streetlamp. The bird watched me as I walked by. Maybe it was the way the bird was perched, but this bird reminded me of an incident that occurred after the Yellowstone Fires of 1988. It was the summer Yellowstone National Park went up in smoke, burning over 30 percent of the Park's total acreage and coming uncomfortably close to the historic Old Faithful Inn. More than 25,000 firefighters battled the blaze, with as many as 9,500 fighting at one time. It was truly an inferno for the record books!

After the fires were out. park rangers began their trek up a mountain to assess the inferno's damage. One ranger found a bird literally petrified in ashes, perched like a statue on the ground at the base of a tree. It was an eerie sight to say the least. He took a stick and knocked the bird over. When he struck it, three tiny chicks scurried from under their dead mother's wings. The loving and devoted mother, keenly aware that her babies were in danger, had carried her offspring to the base

of a tree and had gathered them under her wings. She could have flown to safety but had refused to abandon her babies. When the blaze arrived and the heat singed her small body, the mother had remained steadfast, refusing to move. Because she had been willing to die, those under the cover of her wings lived.

What a beautiful picture of what Veterans do for America! Just as the bird tucked her chicks under her wings to save them from the forest fires raging around her, Veterans tuck America under their protective service, with no thought to their own safety, to save America and her allies from the raging inferno of terrorism and other world evils. Most importantly, this is a beautiful picture of what God does for all of us. He is a refuge and strong tower for us to run to as He tucks us under His wings. As stated in Psalm 91:4, "He will cover you with His pinions, and under His wings you may seek refuge." When life gets tough and we need a protective shelter, God is there bidding us to take shelter under His wings.

As we approach Veterans' Day, let us not forget that God enables Veterans to be the wings under which America and her allies may seek refuge and protection. Let us also not forget to Be the One for a struggling Veteran. We can be the wings under which they can seek safety, protection, and healing. Happy Fall and Happy Veterans' Day!



Airborne Hazards and Burn Pit Exposures Read about presumptive conditions.

"Airborne hazard" refers to any sort of contaminant or potentially toxic substance that we are exposed to through the air we breathe. While on active duty, military service members may have been exposed to a variety of airborne hazards including:

- The smoke and fumes from open burn pits
- Sand, dust, and particulate matter
- General air pollution common in certain countries
- Fuel, aircraft exhaust, and other mechanical fumes
- Smoke from oil well fires

VA understands that many Veterans are especially concerned about exposure to the smoke and fumes generated by open burn pits.

In Iraq, Afghanistan, and other areas of the Southwest Asia theater of military operations, open-air combustion of trash and other waste in burn pits was a common practice. The Department of Defense has now closed out most burn pits and is planning to close the remainder.

Depending on a variety of factors, you may experience health effects related to this exposure. Factors that may indicate you have a greater or lesser risk of short or long-term health effects (Continued on Page 9)

include:

- Types of waste burned
- Proximity, amount of time, and frequency of exposure
- Wind direction and other weather-related factors
- Presence of other airborne or environmental hazards in the area

Researchers, including experts at VA, are actively studying airborne hazards like burn pits and other military environmental exposures. Ongoing research will help us better understand potential long-term health effects and provide you with better care and services.

Many health conditions related to these hazards are temporary and should disappear after the exposure ends. Other longer-term health issues may be caused by a combination of hazardous exposures, injuries, or illnesses you may have experienced during your military service including blast or noise injuries.
