As I was preparing for the Eisenhower Pilgrimage recently, I ran across a few interesting facts about 34th President Dwight D. Eisenhower I'd like to share with you. I think you will find them interesting as well. The one thing I noticed in my research was not only did "Ike" believe he was a "deeply religious" man, but his actions as President were also in alignment with

his belief.

After he was elected President, he was baptized and joined the National Presbyterian Church. He frequently attended this church with his wife Mamie during the eight years of his presidency. He also began his first Inaugural Address on January 20, 1953, with a prayer he wrote. His emphasis on prayer extended to his cabinet meetings, which

began with a moment of silent prayer. During his administration, the phrase "under God' was added to the Pledge of Allegiance and Congress also adopted "In God We Trust" as our national motto. He often spoke of the importance of religious faith as an "essential foundation stone" for democracy and he supported the American Legion's "Back to God" campaign.¹

A Scripture that comes to mind in pondering the actions of this man of God is Isaiah 26:4: "Trust in the LORD forever, for in GOD the LORD, we have an everlasting Rock." Another one that equally applies here is Psalm 146:5: "How blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD his God." For President Eisenhower, God was his rock, his help, and his hope. May we follow Ike's lead and look to God as our rock, help, and hope. God bless you as you serve Him! Be the One! Love and blessings to all!





<u>Individual Unemployability: A Benefit for Veterans</u> Understanding Individual Unemployability -

Legionnaires, if you have service-connected disabilities that make it difficult to maintain a steady job, you may be eligible for Individual Unemployability (IU). This benefit allows veterans to receive 100% disability compensation even if their combined disability rating is less than 100%.

Criteria for Eligibility -

To qualify for IU, you must meet the following criteria:

- Service-Connected Disabilities: You must have at least one service-connected disability rated at 60% or more, or two or more service-connected disabilities with at least one rated at 40% or more and a combined rating of 70% or more.
- Inability to Work: Your disabilities must significantly impair your ability to work and prevent you from maintaining substantially gainful employment.

Seeking Assistance -

If you believe you qualify for IU, it's recommended to seek assistance from a Veterans Service Representative. VSRs can help you understand the application process, gather necessary documentation, and represent your claim.

Remember: Every veteran's situation is unique. It's important to consult with a VSR to determine if you meet the specific IU criteria and get personalized guidance.
